# PATROL OPERATIONS DIVISION

## STAR Corridor Update

Officers handled **20** calls for service in this area; completed **36** park, walk and talk activities as well as **36** hours of traffic enforcement and general observation time. Officers had **60** community contacts and conducted **5** roll call meetings.

### **Patrol Highlights**

### SPECIAL OPERATIONS DIVISION

Under the command of Special Operations Division, the **Investigative Unit** is comprised of three investigators led by Lt James Shelhorse. This operational component is responsible for the investigation of all felony and serious/repeat misdemeanor offenses reported to the police department. Additionally, this unit is tasked with proactive investigations into narcotics trafficking and other criminal behavior.

#### Investigative Highlights

Investigators handled 5 CART referrals from CPS during the month. (CART= Child Abuse Response Team)

Investigators continue work on follow up details and interviews of witnesses for the homicide trial in November.

Investigators worked with U.S. Marshalls to locate two individuals wanted from a robbery in August on South Taylor Street. One of the individuals was also wanted for narcotics indictments. One individual was captured after a foot pursuit and the other was located in a hotel room in Henrico.

Investigators worked two embezzlements this month. One case was the result of an Adult Protective Service referral and the other is still ongoing. It is a larger scale embezzlement case in which investigators have written several records search warrants and are working with FBI officials.

Investigators assisted Caroline County SO with a shooting case which occurred after the individuals travelled through Ashland. Investigators reviewed video footage which led to the development of the suspect's vehicle. Also investigators assisted with forensically processing the suspect vehicle.

Investigators conducted surveillance on a vehicle which revealed a female with possession of narcotics with intent to distribute.
